

Maple Malory Wolfville Food and Drink Options

Although smaller than most university towns, Wolfville sports the typical array of places to eat and drink, from (very) low-scale to more upscale. The town is small enough that you can explore your options pretty easily, but here are some obvious possibilities:

Those of you staying in residence are able to breakfast at Wheelock Dining Hall. Guests pay cash at the door at Wheelock for breakfast. The price is \$8.47 + tax.

Troy Restaurant: out the main BAC entrance, across Main St and through the clock park: look for the giant wooden horse!

The **Library** Pub (Main St) offers an excellent range of local craft beer, a few imports, and a small menu ranging from fishcakes to the best hamburger in town: <http://thelibrarypub.ca/>

Paddy's Pub and Rosie's Restaurant (Main St) is as it says. Their menu is reasonably priced and reasonably wide-ranging, and they make their own beer.
